It has been a long time coming but finally it is here. Onsite learning is returning this Monday for all students years 7-12.

I want to begin by thanking everyone for their efforts during flexible remote learning. It has been challenging for everyone students, parents and staff, particularly this second remote learning.

Thinking about the positives to take away from remote learning there are a number that come to mind. In the first instance more control over your own learning. Having the flexibility to decide when you sit down and do the work, working around the time of day that best suits you have been a major decision for students. With this flexibility comes self-discipline and time management making sure that the time is put aside to do the work. The other area of learning that went ahead in leaps and bounds has been the use of technology. Throughout remote learning both staff and students have immersed themselves in the use of different computer programs and become familiar with technologies they might never have used. What it all shows is how adaptable and resilient we are. Great job everyone but I look forward to seeing you all back.

As we are still returning under the COVID cloud I would ask everyone to follow the safe hygiene practices.

Wear a face mask. Bandanas, scarves, face shields are no longer acceptable. It needs to be a proper fitting face mask. Disposable ones will be available at the front door.

Regularly wash your hands with warm soapy water.

Regularly use the provided hand sanitizer which is available at every classroom, the Library and the school entrance.
