5 TIPS TO KEEP YOU SHINING BRIGHT

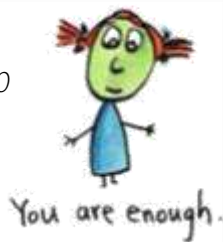
1. Surround yourself with people you love, and who love you for you.

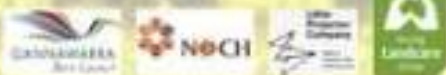
