IFARM;

On Thursday, the school's iFarm arrived!

The "iFarm" is a fully computerised interactive farm science research station designed specifically for Australian high schools. Its purpose is to improve student's understanding of the resources required to produce food and fibre. and to stimulate interest in careers in agriculture and related fields. Students can do comparative trials, measuring and monitoring all variables such as water, fertiliser and plant growth.

iFarms have 8 individual growing beds with subsurface drip irrigation and overhead spray options, a 2000L water tank, moisture and temperature sensors, and an inbuilt digital touchscreen (but can also be operated remotely). iFarms are fully powered by wind and solar, they have their own weather station, a composting worm farm, and come with both summer plastic and it has fold-down perspex sides to view root growth. It also has perspex covers over all the electronic componentry to help students view and better understand electrical design. The iFarm is literally a platform designed to capture the attention of students as it showcases a huge range of learning opportunities and future employment possibilities. There are only 6 in Victoria and 56 for the whole country. We are very excited to receive the ifarm and believe that it will value add to the Science and Agricultural studies at KTHS. The iFarm project has been supported by funding from the Australian Government Department of Agriculture, Fisheries and Forestry as part of the Educating Kids About Agriculture: iFarm program.


