'COURAGE TO CARE':

This week our Year Seven and Eight's participated in an incursion brought to them by the 'Courage to Care' team.

'Courage to Care' has as its purpose, to promote acceptance across society by:

- Creating awareness of the dangers of prejudice, racism and discrimination
- Educating to challenge attitudes and behaviours
- **Demonstrating** that every individual can make a difference
- Transforming "bystander" behaviour to "upstander"

It achieves this by sharing personal family experiences from the holocaust. It is a powerful experience where students hear from people who have been directly impacted by experiences of WW11; quite often telling stories of amazing survival or loss of loved ones. These stories were then linked to inform about the dangers of prejudice, racism and discrimination.

These are valuable lessons for KTHS students and fit in well with the school values of Responsibility, Respect and Resilience.

POLICE VISIT:

The Police came to our school to talk to the Year 10, 11 and 12 students.

Their presentation was mainly focused on Young Adults and the Law.

Topics such as learning drivers, drugs and alcohol, sexting and their responsibilities as law abiding citizens were all covered.

IMPORTANT NOTICE RE:

GOVID-19

With flu season upon us, here is a timely reminder about current Covid regulations:

Students who report a positive result are recommended to isolate for a minimum of 5 (five) days and not attend school until their symptoms have resolved.

Please let the school know via Xuno if this is the case. Please note that schools do not need to notify the relevant classes anymore.

It is recommended that Rapid Antigen Tests (RATs) are used by students and staff:

- If you have symptoms of COVID-19 infection, no matter how mild;
- If you are a household or close contact of someone who has COVID-19;
- If you are a social contact of someone who has COVID-19.

RATs are available from the General Office if needed.

The Department of Health recommends that masks should be worn by a person who is a close contact of someone who has tested positive for COVID-19 when leaving home.

Additionally, the Department of Health recommends that masks should be worn by a person who has COVID-19 for at least 7 (seven) days after a positive test when they need to leave home.
