PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

Grade 6 Transition:

On Thursday the Grade 6 students coming to Kerang Technical High School had a full day transition day at the school. While here they experienced what a day at high school would be like participating in school life as it will be for them next year. They were divided into classes, received a timetable and had to find their way to each and every class. I am pleased to say no one became lost and everyone seemed to enjoy their time at KTHS,

The purpose of this day is to introduce the students to Kerang Technical High school and provide a taste of what life will be like. It gives them the opportunity to interact with students from different schools who will be their classmates next year and it allows them to develop ways of dealing with any concerns they may have for 2024. By attending these transition days, it makes the environment familiar and coming across to Secondary school less daunting.

School Wide Positive Behaviour Program:

Staff have been working very hard behind the scenes moving toward the implementation of School Wide Positive Behaviour (SWPB).

You may remember the work done on the school values of Respect, Resilience and Responsibility. As part of the implementation, threshold points need to be met to progress to the next stage. Last Thursday the school undertook the first Tiered Fidelity Inventory. Here the School Wide Positive Behaviour Regional Coordinator visited the school and conducted the assessment. She visited students from all year levels and staff to ask them questions about the school values and then met with the SWPB Team to discuss her findings and assess the school. I am pleased to say that the school passed the first assessment and is now preparing to implement the second stage. One of her comments that resonated with me was that she "could feel the change in the school."

This is a great result as a lot of work has been put in behind the scenes led by a dedicated team of staff Sharon Champion, Natalie Rose and Donna Oosterlaak.

Year 12 Exams:

Year 12 Students are now officially in Swat Vac in preparation for their exams of which the first one is English Tuesday 24th October. As a school we wish them all the best and remind them that staff are available to catch up with between now and the exams know that mock exams have been held for practise and students should also make use of these.

Curriculum Day:

Monday 6th November has been set aside as a Curriculum Day and no students will be at school. During this day staff will be updating their First Aid qualifications and doing some work on restorative conversations. These are conversations held with students to rebuild the relationship after there has been a misbehaviour in class. David Vinegrad a renowned academic in this field and will be leading the sessions. *David talks about....*

5 Key Strategies in building classrooms that promote positive behaviours – planning lesson content & planning for behaviour must go hand in hand! What you teach and how you teach it will impact on how students behave.

1. Engage! Develop interesting lessons that are differentiated for a wide range of abilities, achievable steps so students know they are learning and succeeding, and summative & formative feedback is gathered by student participation.



2. Routines & procedures! When classrooms are safe and predictable students will do the right thing most of the time

- **3. Acknowledgement & feedback!** When students know they are learning and have a respectful relationship with you and others they will develop a positive mindset.
- 4. Behaviour promotion!
- 5. Expectations & rules

This is then linked to The 3 fundamentals of cooperative classrooms and positive classroom climate – lesson content, instructional practice, and relationships.



National Carers Week is a time to recognise, celebrate and raise awareness for the 2.65 million Australians who provide care and support to a family member or friend.



Carers are people who provide unpaid care and support to family members and friends who have a disability, mental health condition, chronic condition, terminal illness, an alcohol or other drug issue or who are frail aged.

Anyone can become a carer, at any time and more than 1 in 10 Australians are carers. Carers represent a diverse range of cultures, ages, experiences and responsibilities, but all of them balance of caring responsibilities with other responsibilities like work, study and their physical and mental health. https://www.carersvictoria.org.au

Young Carers ~ help is at hand 1 in 10 carers in Victoria are under 25. **Carers Victoria** believes all young carers have a right to enjoy life and reach their potential. Many young carers do not identify as a carer. There are more than 71,600 young carers in Victoria with many hidden in the community so these figures are likely to be higher. Caring responsibilities can





Young carers are children and young people aged up to 25 who care for a family member, usually a parent or sibling with a disability, mental illness, chronic condition or terminal illness. Young carers may also look after an older person with care needs.



There are more than 62,400 young carers in Victoria. Young carers are hidden in the community so these figures are likely to be underestimates. Many do not identify as a carer.



Two-thirds of young primary carers are caring for a parent.

Nearly 8,000 young carers in Victoria are aged under 15 years old with some taking on care responsibilities from as young as five or six years old.

Young women and young people from CALD or Indigenous backgrounds are more likely to be young carers.

1 in 12 carers is under 25, with over 234,000 young carers Australia-wide

have positive effects, such as developing skills and building strong relationships, as well as some negative short and long-term effects such as poor health and wellbeing, social isolation, difficulty with transitions into adulthood.

Young Carers can take on a range of responsibilities including: shopping, cooking, cleaning, washing and household chores. Assisting with mobility, grooming, bathing, toileting, social and emotional support, managing financial issues, care for other siblings, liaising with service



providers and health care professionals e.g. making appointments, discussing treatments and medications, interpreting for family members where English is a second language, and looking after siblings who have a disability if a parent is unable to look after them because of their own health issues.


Young Carers can find support with things like:


