PRINCIPAL'S REPORT No School Accident or Personal Property Insurance:

At times, the school is required to call an ambulance if a student is injured or sick. The school will always err on the side of caution and call an ambulance. The school will try to contact the respective parents but sometimes the phone is not answered.

Therefore, I would like to remind all parents and guardians that::

* Parents/Guardians of students, who do not have student accident insurance, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance/transport and any other transport costs; *and*

* Parents/Guardians can purchase insurance policies from commercial insurers.

Further to this, the Department does not hold insurance for personal property brought to schools and it has no capacity to pay for any loss or damage to such property.

Brylee is working one day a week at the Gannawarra Shire in the Childcare Centre and is enrolled in Certificate III in early Childhood Education and Care Traineeship.

Chase has started one day a week at AB Building Constructions and is enrolled in Certificate III in Engineering – Fabrication Trade.

This is an exciting start to the year for these students and Head Start thank these businesses for the opportunities and support of SBAT's.

Head Start is a revised model for school-based apprenticeships and traineeships (SBAT) undertaken by students which allows students to spend more time in paid work and on the job training to develop the skills that industry and employers need whilst also attending school to work toward a Year 12 qualification.

Students are supported by a Head Start Coordinator, their role is to support students to ensure they are progressing well with their schoolwork, training and employment.

The students have reported that they enjoy being able to break up their school week with work whilst working toward completing Year 12 and it has assisted them to build their confidence and learn important transferrable employability skills.

Students explore industries by completing Work Based Learning and are matched with a suitable employer. During the SBAT students enrol with a training organisation to complete a Certificate II or III level qualification.
