PRINCIPAL'S REPORT BUILDING WORKS:

A lot of building works is happening around the school. The basketball court is currently being ripped up and a lot of mess is being created from this work site. Eventually two new basketball courts will be laid. The old Science building has been demolished and we are awaiting topsoil to fill the hole left. Work is about to begin on restumping the western end of the entrance building. This will require rooms to be blocked off as well as part of the corridor including the link and Rm 16 and Rm 17. A lot of patience will be required to complete the work. The difficulty is this work was planned for the holidays, but all works were pushed back due to the rain.





SNAKES:

The school has had a timely reminder to be vigilant when out in the yard. Last week staff treated a student for a suspected snake bite. The outcome was a "dry" bite which means *bitten but no venom injected*. Snakes are about because of the weather. Contributing to snake presence is all the building
