BYOD UPGRADE:

Students with a BYOD will undergo a software update over the next five days. Student safety and learning in a positive, productive environment is the key reason for the upgrade. The classroom management software we are using gives the school the ability to monitor the screen live, collaborate with students and message directly to enhance their learning experience.

The scope of the software is initially having a productivity focus for the Leadership staff only, ensuring the student is on the appropriate learning task and not distracted on other windows or tabs, e.g. ROBLOX & YOUTUBE etc. Whilst the teacher will still monitor screens by walking around, the split second it takes to change a tab or window with shortcut keys the student can easily hide their distraction when needed.

Moving forward, the software gives KTHS the ability to follow many other schools in enabling the students to use their devices to complete assessments and exams. The monitoring of the student screen ensures the assessment completed is authentically the students work.

The software only works when the device is connected to the eduSTAR Department of Education Network. If the device is connected to any other network the software does not function. KTHS has no access to the device at home.

Survey results will be communicated to parents / caregivers / guardians through annual reporting and the school newsletter. Last year we used the survey results to plan the School Wide Positive Behaviour Program and school incursions.








Congratulations Henry and Thomas

Dear Parent/Guardian

A number of our senior school students are driving or intend to drive to school this year and some have indicated that they intend to carry another student as a passenger.

Despite the fact that most young drivers try to be careful, safety conscious and considerate when driving, research clearly shows that they are at a higher risk of having a serious crash than older, more experienced drivers.

The presence of young passengers also greatly increases the risk for teenage drivers and, the more passengers, the greater the risk.

It is important that all students and their parents/guardians are aware of these risks and the type of behaviour that the school expects from student drivers.

Copies of the school Policy on student drivers and the Parent Permission and Student Agreement Form are available upon request.

The policy outlines the school's expectations and provides information regarding the transport of passengers. Of particular note is that student drivers are not permitted to carry other students as passengers to and from school.

Under the Graduated Licensing System, no more than one peer aged passenger (aged 16-22 years) is permitted to travel with the driver, unless the passengers are siblings of the driver. The school requests that only siblings to travel to and from school with the licensed driver. This is based on research that shows that young drivers carrying several passengers are more likely to engage in risk taking behaviour. For more information, go to:

To ensure that all involved are aware of these requirements, student drivers and a parent/guardian are required to sign a Parent Permission and Student Agreement Form.

The form must be signed and returned prior to students using the designated parking area on Burgoyne Street

These requirements are intended to ensure the welfare and safety of students at our school and the local community.

They offer a sense of belonging, acceptance, and understanding, making them invaluable to our well-being.


This day also promotes peace and unity across cultures and borders. It encourages us to build bridges, reach out to others, and foster meaningful connections with people from different backgrounds.

Scabies Awareness

What is scabies?

Scabies is a skin infestation caused by mites which leads to red bumps or blisters on the skin which are very itchy and need treatment to get rid of them. The mites burrow into the skin to lay their eggs which hatch and spread to other parts of the skin when you scratch. They are spread by direct, prolonged physical contact. It's possible to get scabies from infected belongings (such as bed linen and clothing), although this is much less common. They can

affect anyone regardless of how often they wash and are not a sign of poor hygiene.

Scabies main symptoms

- intense itching of the skin typically worse at night and after a hot bath or shower
- it can be difficult to see the areas where scabies burrow into the skin between the fingers and in skin folds (such as armpits and genitals)
- a mild rash, which can occur on large areas of the body
- itchy bumps in the genital area.

Scabies rash may not show. The itching may last 2 to 3 weeks, after treatment.

Duration of scabies infection

Symptoms usually develop 3 to 4 weeks after infection. If you have previously been exposed you may develop symptoms within 24 to 48 hours.

Generally, a person is no longer infectious 24 hours after treatment.

Diagnosing scabies

It can be diagnosed by observing signs and symptoms or identifying burrows on the top of the

Or confirmed by taking a skin scraping and identifying the mites and eggs under a mícroscope.

Scabies treatment is with a special cream or lotion available from a chemist. Don't wash your hands after applying cream & leave on for 12 to 24 hours and then wash thoroughly. It may be easier to apply in the evening S leave on overnight. Repeat treatment after F days to kill recently hatched mites.

Treat clothing and bedding for scabies

Any clothing, bedding or towels used in the last 2 days should be washed on a hot cycle and

dried in the sun, tumble-dried or dry-cleaned. Seal items that cannot be washed (such as clothing and shoes) in a plastic bag for one week.

Peventing scabies and reinfection or passing scabies on to others, follow treatment instructions carefully.




