PRINCIPAL'S REPORT

START TO TERM 4:

It has been a smooth start to the term with the students settling quickly and already there is a lot going on. On Thursday, 11 students made the trek to Bendigo to compete in the Loddon Mallee Regional athletics. (see Pg 2). The winners from the various zones competing against one another, which include Swan Hill College, St. Mary MacKillop College and Cohuna Secondary College compete at the LMR in Bendigo.

Already Unit 4 students are gearing up for their exam period which begins Tuesday 29th October. Proceeding this, students will have their last class on Tuesday, 22nd October, less than two weeks away! There is still time to keep working on your exam preparations and I wish all students the best.

REVIEW:

The first formal day of the school's review will be held Thursday, 17th October. During this day the school's performance will be measured against a range of goals to see whether they were achieved or not and identify focus areas for the next four years.

The first formal day of a school review is known as the 'validation day' and is where the panel will:

- Validate the pre-review self-evaluation (PRSE) findings through panel discussions, observations, and other evidence. The panel will review and discuss the information and evidence presented in the PRSE, and any other data or evidence presented to the review panel;
- Identify specific areas of the school's practices, particularly related to the Framework for Improving Student Outcomes (FISO 2.0) core elements, that require investigation and analysis through fieldwork;
- Develop terms of reference questions to guide inquiry and seek to understand how specific school practices in each of the FISO 2.0 core elements are impacting student learning and wellbeing outcomes. These can be developed in advance for shorter (2-day) reviews;
- Plan the approach to fieldwork.

The Principal chairs the validation day, the reviewer facilitates and other panel members actively participate throughout the day. The next review day is 30th October will focus on fieldwork where staff, students and parents will be interviewed.

ACTIVE SPORTS PROGRAM:

As shared with you previously, parents and carers of every child enrolled in a Victorian government school in 2025 will receive the one-off School Saving Bonus \$400 support. In the coming months, the Department of Education will send you 2 email communications for each of your children enrolled in Victorian government schools. By Friday, 18 October 2024, please ensure that your child's 2025 enrolment is completed and that your contact information is up to date.

The two emails from the Department of Education will:

1. Confirm your email address between mid-October and late-November.
2. Provide you with your unique \$400 School Saving Bonus code by the end of November.

If you do not receive a confirmation email from the Department by late-November, please check your spam or junk folders and contact the school if needed.

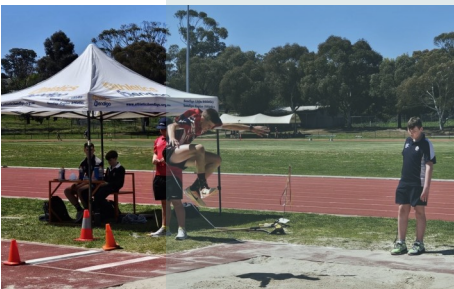
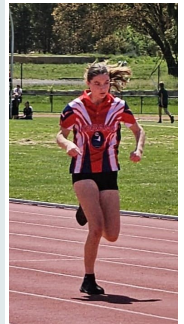

Dear Parent/Guardian

A number of our senior school students are driving or intend to drive to school this year and some have indicated that they intend to carry another student as a passenger.

Despite the fact that most young drivers try to be careful, safety conscious and considerate when driving, research clearly shows that they are at a higher risk of having a serious crash than older, more experienced drivers.

The presence of young passengers also greatly increases the risk for teenage drivers and, the more passengers, the greater the risk.

It is important that all students and their parents/guardians are aware of these risks and the type of behaviour that the school expects from student drivers.

Copies of the school Policy on student drivers and the Parent Permission and Student Agreement Form are available upon request.

The policy outlines the school's expectations and provides information regarding the transport of passengers. Of particular note is that student drivers are not permitted to carry other students as passengers to and from school.

Under the Graduated Licensing System, no more than one peer aged passenger (aged 16-22 years) is permitted to travel with the driver, unless the passengers are siblings of the driver. The school requests that only siblings to travel to and from school with the licensed driver. This is based on research that shows that young drivers carrying several passengers are more likely to engage in risk taking behaviour. For more information, go to:

To ensure that all involved are aware of these requirements, student drivers and a parent/guardian are required to sign a Parent Permission and Student Agreement Form.

The form must be signed and returned prior to students using the designated parking area on Burgoyne Street

These requirements are intended to ensure the welfare and safety of students at our school and the local community.

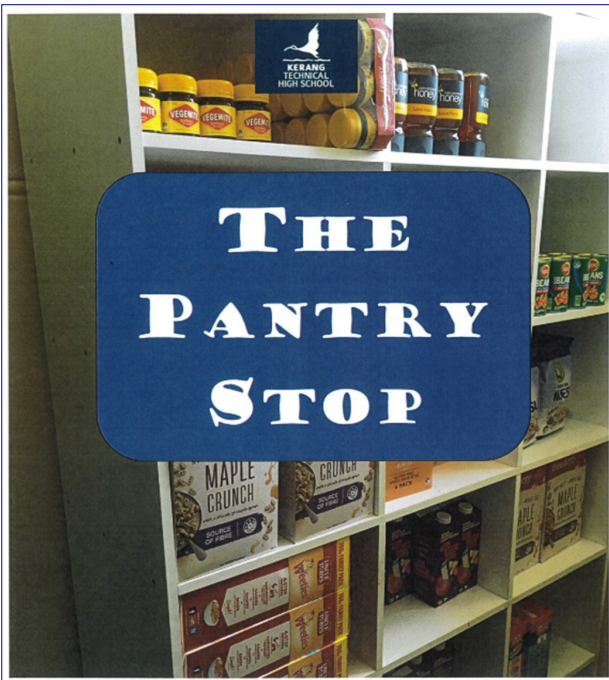
